KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Kindergarten Registration for the 2024-2025 school year is now open. Kindergarten Registration is for students entering Kindergarten in the Fall of 2024. Students must turn 5 years of age on or before September 15, 2024 to attend Kindergarten. Completed immunizations, physical, and a dental exam are required by law for all students entering Kindergarten. Some of the series of vaccines take six (6) months to complete. Start now to make sure all needed immunizations are completed before your child starts school in the Fall 2024!

There are some forms that you will need to download, fill out, and turn into Shannon Elementary by the time your child starts school. Forms include: IDPH Dental Screen, IDPH Vision Screen, Iowan Migrant Parents Form (everyone must fill out), Home Language Survey, and a physical form with LEAD screening date. These forms are located in the Downloads folder on the school website under Shannon Elementary.

IMPORTANT!

⇒ Before School starts in August <u>all</u> <u>Kindergarten</u>, 7th, and 12th grade <u>students</u> must have their expected immunizations per state law.



- ⇒ <u>All Kindergarten and 9th grade students must</u> have a current Dental screening certificate on file
- ⇒ All Kindergarten students must be up to date on their preschool shots and have received their 4year-old boosters of Dtap, Polio, MMR, and Varicella.
- ⇒ All 7th grade and above students must show proof of having received a Tdap (Tetanus/ Acellular Pertussis) vaccination booster AND a Meningococcal vaccination on or after 10 years of age.
- ⇒ All students in grades 7-12 interested in participating in sports must have a current physical and concussion form on file.
- ⇒ All 12th grade students must show proof of receiving 2 DOSES of Meningococcal vaccine; or 1 dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older.

Facility Next Steps: A New Elementary School!

It's hard to believe it has been six years since residents of the Monticello Community School District voted to approve funding to construct a new middle school.

In the fall 2020, we celebrated the opening of the new middle school, and last year, our community said goodbye to the original middle school, which will be the site of a new Thiesen's.

In short, we've accomplished the first phase of the long-term plan agreed upon by the Facilities Advisory Committee made up of parents, staff, community members, business owners, and school board members six years ago.

Now, it's time to implement the second phase: a new elementary school.



Earlier this year, the district reconvened the Facility Advisory Committee to review the original plan. The committee included 30+ individuals, some of whom participated in the last planning effort and others who were able to offer fresh perspectives. They met three times in February and March to revisit the original plan and confirm that a new elementary school to re-

place Carpenter and Shannon Elementary is the next right step for the district.

After reviewing the original plan, touring both elementary schools as well as the new middle school, and learning about the funding strategy, the committee agreed that this is the right time to implement the next phase of the long-range plan.

Because the district has been diligent stewards of taxpayer dollars, and because our community has grown over the last few years, we are able to bond to pay for a new elementary school both earlier and with less impact to the tax levy rate than was originally projected.

Over the last month, committee members collected the more than 250 required signatures needed to petition the board to call an election to pay for the new school. At their April meeting, the board accepted the petition and called the election for Nov. 5.

What's the plan?

A new elementary school at the middle/ high school campus that will replace both Shannon and Carpenter Elementary to realize the district and community's long-term of creating a central educational campus.

How will we pay for it?

To pay for the estimated \$26.5 million elementary school, the district is proposing funding from a combination of sources:

- General Obligation Bond: \$15 million
- Sales Tax Revenue Bond: \$10 million
- Dedicated Facility Cash Reserves: \$1 to \$2.5 million

What's next?

On Nov. 5, voters of the Monticello Community School District will be asked to vote on a measure that would allow the district to raise the property tax levy rate by \$1.10 per \$1,000 of taxable (not assessed) property value.

There will be many opportunities to learn more about the plan. We hope you will attend in person events and ask questions. Your participation in the vote is critical to our district and community's future.

COMMUNITY CONNECTION

- 50% of all lifetime mental illness begins by age 14, and 75% by age 24
- Everyone will face challenges in life that can impact their mental health

Monticello Community School District has been able to bring awareness and meet mental health needs by hiring two school based therapists for the 2023-2024 school year. With the collaboration between the amazing group of school counselors, school social worker, and school based therapists, the district has resources to offer to all students that are in need. It is never too soon to seek treatment for you or your child's mental health. Remember, **YOU ARE NOT ALONE**.
