Hi everyone,

I am sure you have noticed that the conversations around the Elementary School Bond have increased with the start of the school year. Getting the facts out to the community will continue to be a priority between now and November 5. I want everyone to be informed about this bond issue when they walk into the polls on November 5. We are collecting all of our information and putting it on our website, www.monticello.k12.ia.us for everyone to look at or forward to others that have questions. Go to our website, on the main page look for the little schoolhouse with a yellow circle around it, click that icon labeled "Elementary Bond" and explore all of the information on the Elementary School Bond. If you do not find an answer to your questions there, please email me and I will get you an answer.

There is one question I would like to answer today because it has come up again recently and that is, **What will happen to Shannon and Carpenter Elementary if we build a new elementary school?** It would take until the summer of 2026 to get a new building built so I would anticipate that during that building phase of the project we would take the following steps:

- The school board would create a timeline for those buildings, similar to what we did with the old middle school.
- 2. That would begin with a time when we would ask our community to share ideas with the school board about the two buildings. With the old middle school several people visited the school site to explore ideas they had. This is where all ideas can be put on the table.
- When that time comes to an end, then the board would consider what option or options were the best for our community.
- 4. Then we would open it up to the community for feedback. With the old middle school, we asked for survey feedback and had visitors share ideas at our board meetings.
- 5. Finally, the school board would make a final decision with the best interest of the community in mind. This is where you have to put a little faith in the school board to act in the best interest of the community. If you look at their track record and the decision they made on the old middle school, I am confident that we will land in a really good place.

Following a process like this will open this up to every option imaginable. I do understand that making a decision immediately may put this discussion to rest, but I have often found that a quick decision on something is not always the best decision.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PROJECT

A new elementary school completes campus



Scan to learn more!

The proposed new elementary school to replace both Shannon and Carpenter Elementary Schools will complete the process of creating a central PK-12 campus.

The new school will be located southeast of the middle school. The diagram to the right shows how vehicle traffic could flow from the main entrance to the high school, middle school, and elementary school separately.


As illustrated in the site plan to the right, buses will continue to enter the site as they do today. Elementary school bus riders will enter the building through an entrance where the middle school and elementary school meet. Because more than half of elementary students ride the bus and an additional 45-50 students arrive early for Panther Academy, the number of additional cars entering the campus each morning and afternoon is expected to be minimal. Parents dropping their kids off or




picking them up will enter further to the east (see the teal lines in the graphic) and will continue to the south of the new elementary school, which is the front of the building. There will be two entrances: one main entrance and a separate entrance for Panther Academy (see the floor plans below).

The elementary school will be organized in classroom neighborhoods with PK and Kindergarten and special education on the first level and first through fourth grades on the second level. Panther Academy and the gym will also be on the first level while other specials (art and music) and the media center will be on the second level.
