It is the start of a new year and 2025 that means the start of our Elementary School Project. We have already started by scheduling site-surveying and soil borings to get the project started. Over the next few months we will begin some heavy planning and school design. Diving deeply into the planning phase of the project will be a good way to make our school project funds go a long way. We will look for ways to be efficient and maximize the space we are using as well as plan out every detail so we do not get charged a higher amount for changes that would have to be made later. During the spring/summer of 2025 we will complete the design and planning phase, the blueprint phase, the bidding phase, and we will select a construction company to do the project. That is a lot of work and a lot of details to cover between now and the summer. Stay tuned and I will keep you updated.


District Speech Contest Help Needed! Saturday, January 25

PRESCHOOL INFORMATION

Statewide Voluntary Preschool Programming for Four-Year-Old Children

For the 2025-2026 school year, we are expecting to receive state funding to support preschool programming for four-year-old children. Here are some Frequently Asked Questions to help community members gain a better understanding of what this preschool funding means to Monticello.

Which preschools are partners in the MCSD Program? Little Panthers Preschool (Shannon Elementary) and Sacred Heart Preschool (Sacred Heart School).

How will the funding be used? There are many assurances (i.e., requirements) that need to be met when using preschool funding. Money will be spent to make sure that these assurances are met. The assurances include (but are not limited to):

- Facility requirements including accessibility and playground guidelines
- •Costs associated with teacher and paraprofessional professional development and certifications
- •Paying staff costs for required instruction, program operation, home visits, family nights, and parent/teacher conferences
- Supplies and Equipment

Which children will this funding support? Funding must be used to support children that turn age four on or before September 15. Will my four-year-old receive free preschool? Sacred Heart is a half day programs and is tuition free. Little Panthers is a full day program and has a max tuition of \$135.00. All programs run Monday thru Friday with no preschool on Wednesdays.

Will my four-year-old receive transportation to and from preschool? The school district may be able to provide free transportation using an existing bus route. Check with your preschool provider for more information.

If you are interested in registering our 4-year old for the Little Panthers Preschool for the 2025-2026 school year, please do so in one of the following ways:

1. Download and print the application.

Applications will be available on January 3 and are due February 7. Preschool openings are filled through a lottery method. Head Start slots and Empowerment grants are available. This preschool is an inclusive, full-day program Monday through Friday with no preschool on Wednesdays for students of all needs. Our program offers:

- A certified teacher & paraprofessional
- Learning centers
- Thematic instruction
- Breakfast, lunch, milk, and snack

- Large & small group instruction
- Developmentally appropriate schedule and activities
- Social Skills curriculum

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Kindergarten Registration for the 2025-2026 school year will be ready on January 1st. Kindergarten Registration is for students entering Kindergarten in the Fall of 2025. Kindergarten registration is done all online. You can register on our website at www.monticello.k12.ia.us, click on the registration icon on the home page and then kindergarten registration. Mandatory forms can also be found on the website. These forms need to be turned in by the first day of school.

Students must turn 5 years of age on or before September 15, 2025 to attend Kindergarten. Contact Morgan Murray-Zimmerman at morgan.murray@monticello.k12.ia.us with any questions regarding your Parent Infinite Campus account.



Completed immunizations, physical, and a dental exam are required by law for all students entering Kindergarten. Some of the series of vaccines take six (6) months to complete. Start now to make sure all needed immunizations are completed before your child starts school in the Fall 2025!

There are some forms that you will need to download, fill out, and turn into Shannon Elementary by the time your child starts school. Forms include: IDPH Dental Screen, IDPH Vision Screen, Iowan Migrant Parents Form (everyone must fill out), Home Language Survey, and a physical form with LEAD screening date. These forms are located on the Kindergarten registration page on our website under Registration.
